

The Greenbelt Management Committee serves at the pleasure of the Crystal Lakes Road and Recreation Association Board of Directors. All final decisions are the responsibility of the CLRRA Board of Directors.

Greenbelt Management Committee
Charter

The five to seven members of the Committee serve by appointment of the Board of Directors of the Road and Recreation Association.

The purpose of the Committee is threefold:

FIRST: The Committee is to maintain and enhance the health and beauty of approximately 563 acres of greenbelt and its forests, wetlands and trails by:

- Managing and enhancing the greenbelts to provide maximum enjoyment by the members.
- Coordinating infectious disease surveys/inspections and treatment of affected trees.
- Contracting and supervising professional services for forest management.
- Developing and initiating programs to eradicate noxious weeds.
- Monitoring the wetlands to ensure their viability.
- Developing a master plan to coordinate hiking trail development with a long term goal of having a signed interconnected trail system.

SECOND: The Committee is to promote the maintenance of the forest and reduction of the fire hazard on the 1,637 privately owned lots by:

- Developing programs to educate all members about silvicultural practices.
- Developing programs to notify and assist members with infected trees and other forest management problems.
- Developing and maintaining a resource base and assistance programs for members.

THIRD: The Committee is to develop programs to reduce fire risk by:

- Developing programs for thinning of trees and fuels reduction in all forest.
- Establishing sources of funding for both greenbelts and private lots.
- Developing programs to educate all members about Firewise practices.

The five-year goal is the mitigation of pine beetle and an extensive cleanup/thinning of trees in all greenbelts. This will demonstrate to all property owners how to lessen the risk of forest fires and also encourage the use of silvicultural practices to maintain a healthy forest.

This Charter will be reviewed every September and any revisions will be submitted to the Road and Recreation Board in October.
